WP-Research

In <u>WP 1</u> (Concepts/Synthesis) the first posters for the exhibition "<u>The change of</u> <u>Leipzig, reflected by UFZ urban research</u>" were finalized. The opening ceremony with the UFZ's executive management and the city authorities takes place on November 2nd at 6pm. Scientists from <u>WP 2</u> (Urban Land Use & UES) and WP4 organized the panel "The challenge for nature-based solutions: to be socially inclusive" at the <u>ALTER-Net conference</u> in Ghent, Belgium in May. Additionally, WP2 organized an international workshop on "Socio-environmental change in cities - governance challenges and potentials for transformation towards more sustainability" at UFZ with 20 experts. <u>WP 3</u> (Sustain. Water Infrastructures) further meetings with Leipzig's water supply company about possible cooperation



took place. In <u>WP 4</u> (Env. Risks & Vuln.), two colleagues from Chile visited the UFZ in June and continued the cooperation on Climate change adaptation in Santiago de Chile. Daniel Hertel started in August his PhD thesis, financed through the Deutsche Bundesstiftung Umwelt. His work deals with climate modeling in urban areas.

Annual meeting of the entire IP UrbTrans consortium



During this year's annual meeting on July 6 several focal points of our IP research in Leipzig were visited. The IP-members were informed about flood risk areas and the demonstration center for decentralized waste water management in Leutzsch, the restructured large housing estate in Grünau and a brownfield re-use area in Plagwitz. A number of discussions with stakeholders to illustrate the collaboration between science and practice took place. The excursion also included a boat trip to discover the green and blue infrastructures of Leipzig's inner-city from a new perspective. International networks

This category of our Newsletter introduces some of the international networks of members of our IP:

- <u>PEER</u> is a partnership of eight of the largest European environmental centers. Since 2014 an own Working Group on Sustainable Urbanization exists; our IP is represented through K. Krellenberg.
- In this function she attended the Scoping Workshop of the <u>Belmont Forum on Food, Water & Energy for Sustainable</u> <u>Global Urbanization</u> (Boulder/Colorado, June 29 – July 02). During the event, future concepts for funding urban research collaborations were discussed.
- The <u>Joint Programming Initiative Urban Europe (JPI UE)</u> is a European network on urban research, financed by the member states of this initiative. It aims to coordinate research on urban transformations towards sustainability.

- UFZ will be the German representative of the recently funded Urban European Research Alliance (UERA).
