Our aims:

- Analysis of <u>economic advantages</u> of bio-based production
- Economic and legal analysis of <u>institutional framework conditions</u> for the wood-based bioeconomy
- Recommendations for further <u>policy development</u>:
 - to ensure that bioeconomy advantages are reflected in markets
 - to safeguard sustainability and acceptance of the bioeconomy





Working Group "Governance of the Bioeconomy"



Our approach (I):

- Development of scenarios for the wood-based bioeconomy in Germany
- How to ensure that bioeconomy advantages are reflected in markets?
 - <u>Example:</u> Fair competitive framework conditions through adequate climate policy, also for material resource uses
 - How to ensure sustainability and acceptance of the bioeconomy?
 - Example: Solutions for sustainability conflicts in wood provision, e.g. strengthening links to circular flow economy concept







Working Group "Governance of the Bioeconomy"



Our approach (II):

- Legal and economic analysis of institutions' supporting or inhibiting impacts along the value chain
 - Example: Impacts of renewable energy policies on competition for biomass resources
- Identification of economic and legal instruments to support the aims of the bioeconomy
 - Examples: Legal framework conditions for the cascading use of wood; policy mix for a welldeveloped innovation system
- Recommendations for changes in legal framework conditions for bio-based products
 - Examples: Waste materials and hydrothermal carbonization; wood-based buildings
