WP-Research

In <u>WP 1</u> (Concepts/Synthesis) we continued our work on the exhibition "The change of Leipzig, reflected by UFZ urban research", which is presented from Nov. 1-30, 2015 during Leipzig's 1000nd anniversary celebrations. The exhibition takes place at Neues Rathaus (Leipzig Townhall) and will be accompanied by an event program on selected urban studies issues. In <u>WP 2</u> (Urban Land Use & UES), 10 international experts have already confirmed their participation at the workshop "Socio-environmental change in cities - governance challenges and potentials for transformation towards more sustainability" (June 1, 2015 at UFZ). <u>WP 3</u> (Sustain. Water Infrastructures) has published a report on the fourth waste water treatment stage. The research was financed by the Federal Environment Agency and conducted in cooperation with Leipzig University. It was analyzed if the waste water charge could be a viable way to finance the fourth waste water treatment stage. More information on the study and its results can be found <u>here</u>. In <u>WP4</u> (Env. Risks & Vuln.), a concept to analyze and frame multiple risks is elaborated. In addition, C. Begg is currently working on a project funded through the American National Socio-environmental Synthesis Center (SESYNC). The project (2015-2017) brings together an interdisciplinary group of scientists in order to synthesize datasets and answer the question of how communities learn and adapt to repetitive water-related surprises (e.g. floods in Germany and droughts in the USA).

Annual meeting of the IP UrbTrans

During this year's annual meeting of our IP we will visit several focal points of our IP research in Leipzig. The excursion on July 6, 2015 will contain stops at flood risk areas and the demonstration center for decentralized waste water management in Leutzsch, the large housing estate in Grünau with its socio-demographic challenges and a brownfield re-use area in Plagwitz as well as a boat trip to discover the green and blue treasures of Leipzig's inner-city from a new perspective.
