IP News

New UBA-project NepoBok by Nadine Pannicke (ÖKON) starting in December 2019: The project will show pathways to utilise de-sealing potentials in Germany for restoration of soil functions to foster climate adaptation. Together with IÖR Dresden and Stadtland GmbH, land recycling potentials will be collated and governance recommendations for integrating de-sealing measures into region specific action programmes for e.g. flood prevention and creating green spaces and fresh air corridors will be elaborated.

The Kick-off meeting of the **EC-funded project REGREEN** (**Ellen Banzhaf**/SUSOZ) took place in Aarhus in October 2019: It involved intense exchanges between researchers and practitioners of the urban living labs. A first site excursion to potential nature-based



solutions interventions in Aarhus, Denmark, exemplified the range of needs, their scales and approaches in different neighbourhoods.

Research on ecosystems under pressure in large urban Indian cities along the Himalayan Mountains started in October: Our new PhD candidate, Anees Mangalasseril Mohammad will investigate the human impact in ecologically fragile mountainous urban areas by exploring remote sensing techniques, GIS, social data sets and statistical tools. Delineating a pathway for strengthening resilience of the urban ecosystem in understudied Himalayan urban centres is an important goal of this study.

Annegret Haase attended the 10th conference of the international network Ecosystem Services Partnership (ESP) in Hannover from 21-25 October 2019: Together with Jörg Priess (UFZ, CLE, IP Urban Transformations), Nina Schwarz (University of Twente) and other partners from the Biodiversa project Urban Gaia she chaired a two-slot session on "Urban Green Infrastructure: factors shaping urban ecosystem services and disservices". The 9 papers presented dealt with different factors influencing the provision of ecosystem (dis)services in cities; also ambivalence e.g. between provided and perceived services were discussed. All papers showed a close relationship between the provision of ES and EDS, local and supra-local context factors and the impacts of this interaction on health and well-being of urban populations.



As member of the JPI Urban Europe delegation **Sigrun Kabisch** (SUSOZ) took part in the **World Summit of Local and Regional Leaders (UCLG)** in Durban, South Africa, from 11-15 November 2019: A major focus of the conference was on urban resilience at local level towards extreme events (climate extremes, fire, volcano eruption, earth quakes, terrorist attacks) and urban crises (rising amount of people on the move) and how communities can be prepared adequately. JPI Urban Europe organised an interactive session on Urban

Living Labs to strengthen participative approaches and mutual learning from Global North and Global South.

As part of the **Climate Impact and Vulnerability Assessment 2021**, **Reimund Schwarze** (ÖKON) participated in an expert workshop on "Industry and Trade" that took place on 11 October 2019 at the Federal Environment Agency (UBA) in Berlin.
