



1st International Online Workshop For Environmental Law PhD Students

21 January 2022, 9 am-6pm CET

Results of review & tentative agenda

The Scientific Committee has received 32 abstracts from 30 academic institutions and three continents which were all very interesting and eligible. The interest in the workshop was beyond our expectations and required hard choices to be made as the one-day format allows for only a limited number of presentations. Originally, it was intended to feature only 12 presentations but in view of the number of submissions we decided to extend the duration of the workshop (starting already at 9.00 CET instead of 10.00 CET) and to tighten the schedule in order to accommodate further presentations.

Following this, after a careful scrutiny, the Scientific Committee has selected 17 abstracts as envisaged in the attached draft agenda. The main criteria for the selection included not only clarity of the subject matter and respective research questions and hypothesis, but also the importance and topicality of the legal issues addressed in the wider international context and, finally, our intention to include in the workshop a variety of approaches to conducting legal research as applied in various academic institutions.

The selected Ph.D students are hereby invited to present their dissertation within 10 minutes. Each presentation will be followed by 15 min. discussion. Presentations are expected to feature: (1) the subject matter, (2) the main legal research question(s) and, broadly, the extent of coverage in the literature, (3) the methods and outline of analysis, and (4) the key hypothesis and/or preliminary results. Please use not more than 8 ppt-slides and make sure to strictly adhere to the timing.

The selected PhD-students are kindly asked to extend to their supervisors our invitation to participate in the Workshop and to discuss with us the various presentations.
