The objective of this workshop and the related special issue is to take stock of GoST research on smart cities/ urban digitalization.

Hundreds of cities worldwide are currently undergoing transformation processes based on the promise of using "smart" technologies in order to meet the sustainability challenges of the 21st century.

Following the GoST approach, the workshop seeks to explore crucial but neglected governance issues in areas of urban digital infrastructure/ smart cities by uncovering multi-dimensionalities and temporalities of socio-technical transformations on the ground. Based on case studies in a variety of countries, we seek to explore how transformations towards smart city are governed, by whom, to what end, and with what consequences.
